- **January 15<sup>th</sup> – Chitty Chitty Bang Bang (1968)**  
Dick Van Dyke stars as quirky inventor Caractacus Potts, whose magical flying car transports his family and lovely lady friend, Truly Scrumptious to Vulgaria, a kingdom strangely devoid of children, ruled by the evil Baron Bomburst. (Rated G – 145 minutes).
- **February 19<sup>th</sup> – Ninotchka (1939)**  
Greta Garbo portrays Communist dream Ninotchka: a stern-faced apparatchik who does things entirely by the book -- the Soviet book. She's sent to Paris to arrange the sale of Grand Duchess Swana's jewels for her government, but while taking in the appalling materialism of Paris, Ninotchka meets the Swana estate's Count Leon who melts her icy heart. (Not Rated – 110 minutes).
- **March 19<sup>th</sup> – Blackboard Jungle (1955)**  
Inner-city high school teacher Richard Dadier struggles to maintain his idealism in this gritty drama set in the 1950s. (Not Rated – 101 minutes).
- **April 16<sup>th</sup> – Double Feature – Duck Soup (1933) & Horse Feathers (1932)**  
Two Marx Bros. satirical comedies featured back to back. (Not Rated – 1 hour each).
- **May 21<sup>st</sup> – The Best Years of Our Lives (1946)**  
This classic drama follows three World War II veterans -- Homer, Al and Fred -- as they return to small-town America and try to come to terms with their experiences. (Not Rated – 168 minutes).
- **June 18<sup>th</sup> – The Searchers (1956)**  
After his entire family is viciously wiped out, hardened war veteran Ethan Edwards (John Wayne) embarks on a long journey to find his only surviving niece, Debbie, who has been captured by hostile Comanche Indians. (Not Rated – 118 minutes).
- **July 16<sup>th</sup> – Rebel Without A Cause (1955)**  
When Jim Stark (James Dean) arrives in a new town with his troubled past firmly in tow, he quickly falls for the girl next door and befriends the vulnerable Plato, forming a surrogate family fueled by alienation. (Not Rated – 110 minutes).
- **August 20<sup>th</sup> – Last of the Mohicans (1920)**  
This silent film version of James Fenimore Cooper's adventure novel. During the 18th century wars between the French and English, Huron Indian Magua sides with the French, while Mohicans Uncas and Chingachook remain loyal to the Brits. (Not Rated – 40 minutes).
- **September 17<sup>th</sup> – Bringing Up Baby (1938)**  
Love runs wild for a hapless scientist and an unstoppable heiress in Howard Hawks's classic screwball comedy. (Not Rated – 102 minutes).
- **October 15<sup>th</sup> – Nosferatu (1929)**  
German classic starring Max Schreck in the scariest *Dracula* adaptation ever. (Not Rated – 80 minutes).
- **November 19<sup>th</sup> – Seven Chances (1925)**  
The silent film stars Keaton as Jimmy Shannon, a young man who stands to inherit \$7 million -- if he can find a wife in time. (Not Rated – 60 minutes)
- **December 17<sup>th</sup> – We're No Angels (1955)**  
Humphrey Bogart, Aldo Ray and Peter Ustinov play three escaped inmates who hatch a plan to steal from a shopkeeper on Christmas. But their plans change when they find themselves actually growing to like their target and his family. (Not Rated – 105 minutes).
